3. Download the State of Maine Outline Map. Print it off and shade in where your researched bird lives in Maine.

4. Draw with colored pencils or paint a picture of your bird in its habitat. This should be done on either 8 1/2" x 11" paper (Regular Copy Paper Size) or 9" x 12" Paper.

5. Mount your outline map, Information sheet, and Picture on a Posterboard as shown in the sample project.
